Duties and responsibilities:

- Ability to perform as a head wrestling coach;
- Evidence of strong community interest and participation;
- Strong communication skills;
- Ability to communicate effectively with players, parents, community, and staff;
- Commitment to wrestling program as an integral part of the district school program;
- Ability to grasp and understand student body funds;
- Evidence of good health;
- Ability to relate effectively with colleagues;
- Active association with professional coaching community.

Requirements:

- Valid first aid and CPR cards;
- Applicant must be well versed in the fundamentals of the sport;
- Must be a good role model for students;
- Must have good organizational skills
- Willingness to perform tasks as assigned.

Required Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities Related to Cultural Competence and Equity:

- Ability to recognize and demonstrate awareness of one's own cultural identity as well as accepting and respecting the cultural identity of others.
- Commitment to establishing and supporting an environment that promotes cultural competence and equitable treatment of all staff, students, and families of the district.
- Ability to support and promote the Auburn School District's Strategic Plan.

Working Conditions: Physical Requirements: The position requires frequent physical activity, including standing, walking, demonstrating wrestling techniques, and actively participating in conditioning drills. The coach must be able to assist student-athletes during practices and matches and engage in physical demonstrations. Occasional lifting, carrying, or setting up of equipment weighing up to 50 pounds is expected. The role involves extended periods of physical exertion, such as running practice sessions, managing warm-ups and cooldowns, and supporting athletes during competitions.

Work Environment:

Work is primarily performed in a gymnasium or wrestling facility, with exposure to loud noise levels, fluctuating temperatures, and high-energy environments. The coach may be required to supervise student-athletes during practices, matches, and travel to competitions in varying conditions. Surfaces may be slippery, particularly around mats and training areas. The coach is responsible for the safety, conduct, and supervision of student-athletes and must collaborate closely with school staff, families, and the athletic department.
