Working Conditions:

Physical Requirements:

The position is primarily classroom-based, with the teacher frequently standing, walking, or engaging in instructional activities with students. Responsibilities may require occasional bending, lifting, or carrying science equipment and instructional materials up to 25 pounds. The role also involves supervising student-led recycling and composting

activities, which may include moving between classrooms, lunch areas, and outdoor spaces. Some physical exertion may be required during science labs or hands-on learning projects.

Work Environment:

Work is primarily performed indoors in a middle school classroom and lab setting, with occasional supervision duties in other school areas such as hallways, the lunchroom, or outdoor learning spaces. The noise level is typically moderate to loud, consistent with an active middle school environment. The teacher is responsible for student safety and classroom management, and is expected to collaborate effectively with colleagues, administrators, families, and community partners. There may be occasional exposure to potentially hazardous lab materials, challenging student behaviors, and infectious diseases or bodily fluids.
