### **Description:**

This position provides instruction to students and performs a wide variety of tasks with curriculum planning, supervision, presenting and reinforcing learning concepts, and teaching children in a classroom setting.

#### **Job Responsibilities:**

- 1. Teachers shall perform their duties in accordance with the regulations established by the Board of Education as interpreted by the administration.
- 2. The primary duty of the teacher is to plan and deliver excellent instruction through the use of effective strategies to reach all students.
- 3. Facilitate positive student behavior by establishing expectations an procedures and implementing effective classroom management practices.
- 4. Assess student learning and provide meaningful feedback to student(s) and parents/guardians that will be conducive to learning.
- 5. Maintain and update accurate records as required by the State, District, and Building Administration.
- 6. Demonstrate on-going professional growth in order to stay current with quality practices in curriculum, instruction, and assessment.
- 7. Develop and implement Individualized Education Programs (IEP's) for students in partnership with the IEP team.
- 8. Provide coordination for student's IEP across environments to insure that all IEP services are delivered with fidelity.
- 9. Coolaborate with colleagues and co-teaching partners in the development, implementation, and evaluation of differentiated instruction, materials, an assessment practices.
- 10. Exhibit excellent communication, organization, and interpersonal skills.
- 11. Observe and understand students' behavior and report suspicions of neglect, abuse, etc.
- 12. Develop and enrich professional skills and knowledge through inquiry, attendance at various seminars or conferences, etc.
- 13. Complete all faculty expectations per the Collective Bargaining Agreement.
- 14. Teachers shall conduct themselves in a manner that is above reproach being professional in every aspect associated with the position.
- 15. All other duties as assigned.
