PURPOSE OF POSITION

The purpose of this position is to plan, implement, and manage programs to care for trees and forestry on parks and municipally controlled lands in the City. Duties and responsibilities include developing and implementing tree maintenance programs, supervising personnel, inspecting trees, coordinating related community outreach programs, and performing administrative tasks such as applying for grants and preparing reports.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The following duties are normal for this position. These are not to be construed as exclusive or all-inclusive. Other duties may be required and assigned.

- Develops and implements maintenance programs for trees in City parks and on other City properties; designs and organizes new tree installation projects.
- Inspects trees on City property to determine the need for trimming, removal, or other
 maintenance; inspects property prior to tree plantings to ensure the location is appropriate for
 proper tree development; plans, marks, and coordinates new tree installation; assists in landscape
 design and installation; coordinates elimination of hazardous street trees with other City
 departments.
- Supervises, directs and evaluates assigned staff, handling employee concerns and problems, directing work, counseling, disciplining and completing employee performance appraisals.
- Develops, plans, and coordinates community outreach and tree awareness programs; plans and presents training sessions.
- Maintains inventory of trees on City park land and properties.
- Performs administrative functions such as preparing and maintaining records pertaining to plant material, equipment, and forestry activities; preparing periodic and special reports as required; and preparing grant applications for the funding of horticultural projects.

• Attends staff and other professional meetings to exchange information; attends technical or professional classes, seminars, or conferences to improve professional skills; serves as advisor to public boards, organizations, and City departments in matters of arboriculture.

ADDITIONAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- Coordinates and supervises scheduling of use of maintenance personnel and equipment to assists with arboricultural duties.
- Performs other work as assigned or necessary.

MINIMUM TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE REQUIRED TO PERFORM ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

Associate's degree or equivalent in Forestry, Horticulture, Agriculture or related, with four years of experience in horticulture, forestry, and/or field application experience, including trimming, planting or removing trees, including two years of lead experience with a work crew engaged in these activities required; or any equivalent combination of education, training, and experience which provides the requisite knowledge, skills, and abilities for this position. Must possess a valid Kentucky Driver's License, and Arborist and Pesticide 3 certification.

PHYSICAL AND MENTAL ABILITIES REQUIRED TO PERFORM ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

LANGUAGE ABILITY AND INTERPERSONAL COMMUNICATION

- Ability to assemble, copy, record, and transcribe data and information, following a prescribed plan. Ability to compare, count, differentiate, measure, and/or sort data and information.
- Ability to follow specific instructions and respond to simple requests.
- Ability to utilize descriptive data and information, such as regulations, blueprints, correspondence and general operating manuals.
- Ability to speak before groups, conduct educational and training seminars, and to deal with employees and the public in a calm, professional, diplomatic manner.

MATHEMATICAL ABILITY

- Ability to add, subtract, measure, multiply and divide.
- Ability to use computer for budgeting, inventory control, communication, and various jobspecific software programs.

JUDGMENT AND SITUATIONAL REASONING ABILITY

• Ability to apply situational reasoning ability by exercising judgment, decisiveness and creativity in situations involving a variety of pre-defined duties subject to frequent change.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Ability to operate equipment and machinery requiring monitoring multiple conditions and making multiple, complex and rapid adjustments. Ability to perform minor repairs on machinery.
- Ability to coordinate eyes, hands, feet and limbs in performing skilled movements such as rapid keyboard use.
- Ability to exert mildly heavy physical effort in moderate to heavy work, including lifting, carrying, pushing and pulling. Ability to handle, finger and feel. Ability to stoop, kneel, crouch and crawl. Ability to climb and balance. Ability to reach overhead.
- Able to lift, push and pull over 50 pounds, when cutting and removing tree trunks and branches, and relocating plant materials and soil.

ENVIRONMENTAL ADAPTABILITY

Ability, in regard to environmental factors such as temperature variations, odors, toxic
agents, violence, noise, vibrations, wetness, disease and/or dust, to work under mildly unsafe
and uncomfortable conditions.




