The Role: As a School Psychology Intern, you will play a crucial role in delivering comprehensive psychological services to students ages 3–21. Working under the supervision of a certified school psychologist, you will help assess, plan, and implement strategies that support students' emotional, behavioral, social, and academic needs.

Key Responsibilities:

- Assist in the planning, design, and delivery of school-based psychological services under the supervision of a certified school psychologist.
- Collaborate with school administrators, teachers, and families to support student learning and behavioral needs within a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) framework.
- Support the identification, evaluation, and eligibility processes for special education services, including conducting psychoeducational assessments.
- Participate in multidisciplinary team meetings, including initial evaluations, reevaluations, and eligibility/placement decisions.
- Technical tasks such as scoring assessments, developing written reports, and interpreting data.
- Participate in crisis prevention and response activities, including risk assessment.
- Attend IPS, IEP meetings, manifestation determinations, and other relevant staffing meetings as appropriate.
- Participate in professional learning, supervision sessions, and district-led professional development.

Qualifications:

- Currently enrolled in an accredited graduate program in School Psychology (specialist or doctoral level).
- Completion of foundational coursework and practicum experiences in assessment, consultation, and intervention is preferred.
- Strong interpersonal, consultation, and problem-solving skills.
- Demonstrated commitment to diversity, equity, inclusion, and culturally responsive practice.
- Ability to collaborate effectively within multidisciplinary and educational teams.
- Adherence to the National Association of School Psychologists (NASP) Principles for Professional Ethics.
- Must pass a background check and meet district requirements for working in schools.
