Responsibilities:

- To provide direct educational instruction to youth assigned to DYS.
- To implement lesson and/or unit plans as provided by teacher/teaching coordinator or developed under the supervision of the Teaching Coordinator.
- To participate and implement effective instructional strategies and research based curriculum as rolled out by CES / Comm. Corp Professional Development initiative.
- To integrate individual student's IEP goals and objectives, learning style information and accommodations as needed.
- Upon request, to administer MCAS within the educational setting and ensure the level of security and confidentiality as outlined by the Department of Education.
- To administer various assessments and evaluations to students as indicated by their supervisor.
- To maintain lesson plans on a weekly basis.
- To maintain an effective, creative, and balanced learning environment that meets the needs of the students.
- To collaborate with site team in scheduling, integration of curriculum, and behavioral procedures.
- Follow all safety and security protocols.
- Maintain appropriate boundaries with students.
- To maintain effective/positive relationships with CES, DYS, Vendors, Comm. Corp., and all other colleagues and supervisors.
- To participate in all staff development indicated by supervisor.
- Maintaining inventory of all classroom equipment and curriculum materials.
- Complete training as outlined by CES regional leadership.
- Assume any additional responsibilities as directed by the Executive Director.
