## Qualifications

- Effective communication skills with adults and children
- Secure appropriate paraprofessional certification

## **Performance Responsibilities**

- Provide instructional reinforcement of lesson plans, under direction of the special education/classroom teacher.
- Serve as a positive, nurturing guide for students.
- Model the school's professional, ethical, and communication standards when interacting with students, parents, staff, and community members.
- Supervise students in both instructional and non-instructional settings.
- Support student learning of lesson components, as determined by the teacher, through discussion and reviewing classwork.
- Attend to students' physical, personal, academic, and behavioral/emotional needs.
- Perform duties such as organizing and preparing classroom and teaching materials.
- Establish and maintain collaborative working relationships with students, parents, and staff.
- Other essential duties, training, and responsibilities may be assigned.

## Physical, Sensory, and Environmental Demands

Regularly required to sit, stand, walk, talk, hear, traverse up and down stairs, operate a computer, or other office equipment, reach with hands and arms, and occasionally lift and/or move up to 20 pounds.
