- 8. Collaborate with specialists in an online environment.
- 9. Engage students and ensure they meet the needs of their students through inclusion and other models of effective practice.
- 10. Improve communication and collaboration between the school and the home and community.

#### Know the Content

- 1. Teach the North Carolina Standard Course of Study.
- 2. Develop and apply strategies to make the curriculum rigorous and relevant.
- 3. Develop literacy skills appropriate to specialty areas.
- 4. Develop cross-curricular links in lesson design.
- 5. Direct students' curiosity into an interest in learning.

- 6. Know links between grade/subject and the North Carolina Standard Course of Study.
- 7. Promote global awareness and its relevance.
- 8. Incorporate life skills which include leadership, ethics, accountability, adaptability, personal productivity, personal responsibility, people skills, self-direction, and social responsibility.
- 9. Develop an understanding of effective instructional strategies in an online environment, including the ethical use of technology to support learning.
- 10. Develop an understanding of the tools used in online instruction.

# **Facilitate Learning for Students**

- 1. Know how students think and learn in an online environment.
- 2. Understand the influences on student learning and differentiate instruction.
- 3. Keep abreast of evolving research, specifically as it relates to online learning.
- 4. Adapt resources to address the strengths and weaknesses of students.
- 5. Collaborate with colleagues virtually.
- 6. Use multiple indicators, both formative and summative, to evaluate student progress and engage in short- and long-range planning.
- 7. Monitor and modify plans to accelerate and personalize student learning.
- 8. Respond to cultural diversity and learning needs of students.
- 9. Employ a wide range of techniques using information and communication technology, learning styles, and differentiated instruction.
- 10. Help students use technology to learn content, think critically, solve problems, discern reliability, use information, communicate, innovate, and collaborate.
- 11. Help students develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills utilizing technology
- 12. Teach the importance of cooperation and collaboration.
- 13. Organize learning teams to help students define roles, strengthen social ties, improve communication and collaboration, interact with different cultures and backgrounds, and develop leadership qualities.
- 14. Use assessment systems to inform instruction and demonstrate evidence of students' 21st century knowledge, skills, performance, and dispositions.
- 15. Establish a safe and orderly virtual classroom, with a structure that supports student access to curriculum resources, assignments, teacher feedback, and class policies & procedures.
- 16. Adapt online resources and instructional activities to address the student strengths and weaknesses.
- 17. Engage students in the learning process with the use of blended strategies (traditional and electronic).
- 18. Help students build their digital literacy skills as measured by the ISTE Standards for Students.
- 19. Facilitate students' ethical use of technology to support learning.
- 20. Meet with students in person as required by the Principal of Ignite Academy.
