- Proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing English to understand traffic signs, complete reports, and communicate with the public.
- Physical ability to lift and carry up to 50 lbs and perform other job-related tasks.
- Physical ability to get in and out of the tractor and trailer safely
- Thorough knowledge of traffic laws and commercial driving regulations.
- Strong communication and problem-solving skills.
- Excellent time management and organizational skills.
- Ability to work long, flexible hours and handle the physical demands of the job.
- Familiarity with GPS and route planning software.
