Duties and Responsibilities:

- Design instructional units, lesson plans and educational material for Arapaho culture and language
- Design and implement Arapaho language enrichment activities for K–12 students
- Work with the tribal cultural committee, Northern Arapaho cultural programs, and Native Ways of Knowing staff to integrate culture into classrooms
- Prepare and maintain a classroom that reflects the cultural and heritage of the Northern Arapaho people
- Utilize Elder/Grandparent as classroom role models for students
- Work closely with Northern Arapaho cultural programs and community resources to enhance cultural integration in the school
- Provide appropriate Arapaho Language opportunities for all students
- Work cooperatively with all staff
- Accept responsibilities outside the classroom (game day, parent night, etc.)
- Demonstrate professional growth
- 3 credits in Native American studies or similar course work within two years of hire date
- Integrate technology into learning
- Prepare daily lesson plans with identifiable goals, objectives, learning outcomes and assessments
- Ensure that information is available whenever a substitute is required
- Teach the district and WDE curriculum standards
- Create and maintain a positive learning environment
- Maintain high expectations for students' academic and behavioral performance
- Assess student learning, interpret and analyze student assessment data and adapt instruction
