TITLE: Behavior Specialist

QUALIFICATIONS: 1. BCBA or BCABA certification

JOB GOAL: To assist the staff in developing and implementing behavioral

interventions.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. <u>Learning Climate/Instruction</u>

- Assesses each student related to behavioral concerns.
- Provides follow-up and recommendations on students' progress.
- Provides support services to individual students whose behavior significantly impedes their learning process.

Staff

- Assists the staff in developing behavioral intervention strategies for positive student management for individual students.
- Completes Functional Behavior Assessments (FBA).
- Provides training for staff for implementation of intervention strategies devised.
- Develops documentation procedures to be used by staff to monitor student progress.
- Shares current research with staff about intervention techniques.

3. Other

- Prepares reports as required.
- Participates in meetings/committees, as required.
- Performs other duties within the scope of his/her employment and/or certification as may be assigned.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

The duties of this job require the following physical activities: sitting, standing, reaching, walking, lifting, bending, kneeling, stooping, climbing, pushing, pulling, finger dexterity, carrying, feeling, repetitive motions, speaking, listening, and visual acuity. The employee must lift and/or move up
