JOB DESCRIPTION

QUALIFICATIONS:

- (1) High school diploma or equivalent.
- (2) Two (2) years successful secretarial/clerical experience.
- (3) Competency in language and mathematics, as measured on a screening test with a minimum score of 80% (administration of the test by the hiring authority is optional)
- (4) Typing proficiency of 40 words per minute.
- (5) Computer proficiency.
- (6) Satisfactory criminal background check and drug screening.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

Knowledge of computer software, office equipment, office practices and procedures. Ability to use basic mathematics. Ability to communicate orally and in writing. Ability to schedule time, establish priorities and work efficiently. Ability to compose correspondence and prepare reports in an articulate manner. Ability to promote a harmonious atmosphere and smooth flow of business. Ability to handle constituents' problems, concerns and emotional distress with sensitivity and tact. Ability to answer the telephone in a professional and courteous manner. Ability to handle sensitive information with confidentiality. Knowledge and understanding of all clerical positions within the office. Ability to take initiative to begin projects without supervision.

Service Delivery

- * (1) Perform clerical duties required by activities and functions of the workplace including preparing and sending correspondence; receiving and routing incoming/outgoing mail and courier deliveries; setting up and maintaining files; handling personnel records and requests; prepare applications, reports, forms, grants, records, minutes, guides, manuals and other assigned projects.
- * (2) Greet visitors and direct them to the appropriate area.
- * (3) Receive and deliver student messages.
- * (4) Oversee students who are in the office for disciplinary reasons.

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- * (5) Prepare materials for dissemination to staff, parents and community.
- * (6) Oversee operation and maintenance of office equipment and report malfunctions for necessary repairs.
- * (7) Maintain and/or process all files in an alphabetical or chronological system.
- * (8) Maintain accurate attendance records.
- * (9) Maintain discipline records.
- * (10) Maintain student files.
- * (11) Enroll, transfer and withdraw students.
- * (12) Request and send student cumulative files.
- * (13) Assist with full time equivalent (FTE) surveys and reports.
- * (14) Obtain, assemble and organize pertinent data into usable form for local, state and federal audits.
- * (15) Make arrangements for meetings and conferences.
- * (16) Schedule parent-teacher conferences.
- * (17) Provide miscellaneous clerical services for various boards and committees on which designated supervisors serve.
- * (18) Train and coordinate the work of student aides.
- * (19) Demonstrate initiative in the performance of assigned responsibilities.
