#### **PURPOSE OF POSITION:**

The Reading Specialist/Math Instructor develops and implements a small group instructional intervention program for students based on data gathered through benchmark and diagnostic assessments in reading and math. The Reading Specialist/Math Instructor designs prescriptive and intentional reading and mathematics instruction that is driving the attainment of student achievement outcomes. The Reading Specialist/Math Instructor monitors students' progress and communicates this information to the classroom teacher, administration, and parents. The specialist possesses a deep knowledge of Structured Literacy and evidence-based math instructional approaches. The Reading Specialist/Math Instructor works cooperatively with other Act 89 staff, and with the administration and staff of the Nonpublic School(s) where assigned to ensure quality instruction for all students.

#### **ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:**

All job functions are to be executed through the lens of high quality customer service. Customers are defined as both internal and external clients. Examples demonstrative of high quality service may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- prompt responsiveness to inquiries
- professional and courteous verbal and nonverbal communication
- proactive problem solving
- embody the IU13 keys to culture
- 1. Design and implement data-informed literacy and math instruction rooted in evidence-based practices.
- 2. Provide direct instruction in the areas of reading and math to students in a small group format.
- 3. Implement a range of evidenced-based programs with fidelity according to program guidelines and individual student needs.
- 4. Develop lesson plans and instructional materials to address students' individual needs.
- 5. Administer and analyze benchmark and diagnostic assessments to identify students for intervention based on program guidelines and to plan appropriate instruction.
- Conduct ongoing progress monitoring assessment, and communicate regularly with IU
  personnel, classroom teachers, administrators, parents and students concerning instructional
  goals and progress. Prepare appropriate progress monitoring reports according to required
  timelines.

Participate in the Nonpublic School Services Professional Learning Community (PLC) to expand and maintain a high level of knowledge and implementation of evidence based instructional practices related to Science of Reading, Structured Literacy, and Science of Math through professional collaboration, professional development training, and professional reading.
- 8. Support nonpublic school classroom teachers through modeling, coaching, and/or collaboration using evidence-based approaches and materials.
- 9. Work proactively and cooperatively with intermediate unit, school, and nonpublic staff to coordinate students' programs, provide the appropriate level of support, and solve/assist with problems, issues and opportunities.
- 10. Create and manage individual schedule of student services on caseload.
- 11. Submit digital and written forms and reports in a timely and accurate manner and maintain careful documentation digitally regarding student assessment and attendance data, teaching schedules, lesson plans, and collaborative coaching activities.
- 12. Adheres to the established work schedule through regular and consistent attendance.
- 13. Adhere to intermediate unit policies and procedures.
- 14. Adhere to professional, ethical, and legal standards.
- 15. Observes all IU13 requirements governing FERPA, HIPAA and any IU13 polices on FERPA and/or HIPAA's policies and notices of privacy practices.
- 16. Fulfill all other duties as required by the program director or supervisor to assist with ongoing program development.
