Requirements

- Current valid Ohio Pupil Activity Permit

- Possess a thorough knowledge of the rules, regulations, strategies, and techniques of the sport
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with school administrators, parents, and students

Responsibilities

Grade 8 Cheerleaders during football season and Grade 7 & 8 (Blue team) Cheerleaders during basketball season

Essential Duties

- Assess student athlete's skills and assign team positions
- Develop a regular practice schedule and organize practice time to provide both individual and team development
- Follow the guidance of the district strength coach to set up a conditioning program
- Work with the AD to determine program needs, monitor budget/expenses and scheduling of facilities
- Coach and instruct players, individually and in groups, regarding the rules, regulations, equipment, and techniques of the sport
- Observe players during competition and practice to determine the needs for individual or team improvement
- Determine game strategy based on the team's capabilities
- Monitor individual/team stats throughout the season and postseason and advise players on how to improve
- Establish and maintain standards of decorum and provide proper supervision of athletes at all times
- Monitor the academic performance of team members to ensure that eligibility requirements are met and encourage student-athletes to maintain a high academic standard
- Follow established procedures in the event of an athlete's injury
- Conference with parents/guardians, as necessary, regarding the athletic performance of their student
- Follow state, regional, and district regulations governing the athletic program
- Model sports-like behavior and maintain appropriate conduct towards players, officials, and spectators
- Act as a team representative and promote the sport by communicating with booster clubs, service clubs, community groups, and other organizations
- Follow established procedures for the proper care, maintenance, and requisitioning of equipment, supplies, and uniforms
- Work with the AD to develop a policy for awards and submit a list of winners at the end of the season
- Participate in special activities including fundraising, parent's night, banquets, award nights, and pep assemblies
- Maintain eligibility forms, emergency data, insurance records, equipment inventory, and other related records
- Model non-discriminatory practices in all activities
- Attend staff development meetings, clinics, and other professional activities to improve coaching performance
- Complete any Safe School courses recommended and assigned by the Athletic Director
- Perform any other related duties as assigned by the administration
