## Requirements

- Current valid Ohio Pupil Activity Permit
- Must maintain the training requirements of Pupil Activity Permit through Coaches' Tool Chest
- Complete any Vector/ Safe Schools courses recommended and assigned by the Athletic Director
- Favorable State (BCII) and Federal (FBI) background checks
- Negative drug screen result

## Qualifications

- Experience coaching the applicable sport at a freshman level or higher
- Must possess a thorough knowledge of the rules, regulations, strategies, and techniques of the sport
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with school administrators, parents, and students

## **Essential Duties**

- Assist the head coach in the assessment of each player's skills and assignment of team positions
- Assist the head coach in developing a regular practice schedule and organizing practice time to provide both individual and team development
- Follow the guidance of the district strength coach to set a conditioning program
- Coach and instruct players, individually and in groups, regarding the rules, regulations, equipment, and techniques of the sport
- Assist the head coach in observing players during competition and practice, to determine the needs for individual or team improvement
- Assist the head coach in determining game strategy based on the team's capabilities
- Monitor individual/team stats throughout the season and postseason and advise players on how to improve.
- Establish and maintain standards of decorum and provide proper supervision of student-athletes at all times
- Follow established procedures in the event of an athlete's injury
- Assist the head coach in conferencing with parents/guardians, as necessary, regarding the athletic performance of their student-athlete
- Follow state, regional, and district regulations governing the athletic program
- Model sports-like behavior and maintain appropriate conduct towards players, officials, and spectators
- Follow established procedures for the proper care, maintenance, and requisitioning of equipment, supplies, and uniforms
- Assist the head coach in working with the Athletic Director to develop a policy for awards and submit a list of award winners at the end of the season
- Participate in special activities including fundraising, parents' night, banquets, award nights, and pep assemblies
- Maintain eligibility forms, emergency data, insurance records, equipment inventory, and other related records.
- Model nondiscriminatory practices in all activities
- Attend staff development meetings, clinics, and other professional activities to improve coaching performance
- Perform any other related duties as assigned by the administration
