Instructional Coaching and Teacher Support

Position Summary

The Literacy Coach (Grades 6–8), funded through the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) Cultivating Ongoing Achievement through Coaching in Literacy (COACH) Grant, serves as an instructional leader focused on strengthening literacy teaching and learning in the middle grades.

The coach will provide job-embedded professional learning, model effective instruction, analyze data to inform practice, and collaborate with teachers and administrators to improve literacy outcomes for students.

This role is grounded in the *science of reading* and aligned with the *New Jersey Student Learning Standards for English Language Arts (NJSLS-ELA)*. The coach will help build district and school capacity for sustained literacy improvement and ensure compliance with all COACH grant deliverables and reporting requirements.
