Qualifications:

High school graduate or equivalent.

- Licensed through the State of Michigan to practice as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).
- **CPR and First Aid certified**, or willing to be trained within 30 days of hire (renewal required approximately every two years).
- **CPI (Crisis Prevention Intervention)** trained, or willing to complete CPI training within 30 days of hire and renew annually.
- Minimum of one (1) year of successful experience as a teacher paraprofessional in a special education classroom or day-care training program, or advanced training in a community college or degree-granting institution with a state-approved special education program. (Preferred but not required for current ESP applicants.)
- Summer work is required for this position.

Experience and Skills:

- Experience working with Vents, Trachs, and special needs students.
- Ability to **follow individualized medical plans** and procedures accurately.
- Ability to communicate effectively and work cooperatively with students, staff, parents, and community members.
- Demonstrated physical ability to lift, push, and pull up to 50 pounds regularly.
- Ability and willingness to assist students with bathrooming and other personal care needs.
- Physical management skills necessary for student support and safety.

Medical and Support Responsibilities:

- Provide paraprofessional support in areas such as feeding, mobility, and specialized medical care.
- Perform procedures as required, including:
 - Tube feeding
 - Catheterization
 - Oral suctioning
 - Tracheotomy suctioning
- Monitor and respond to medical conditions requiring **increased supervision or intervention**, such as seizure activity, allergies, or other health concerns.
