You will provide professional learning, technical assistance, resource development and consulting services to local school districts and public school academies within Oakland County.

- Provide leadership and technical assistance in prevention, assessment, intervention, program design, data collection and analysis.
- Plan, create, coordinate, and facilitate problem-solving and implementation supports for new and existing initiatives around evidence-based practices for students with Autism.
- Research, evaluate, create, distribute and curate resources that build the capacity of teachers of students with IEPs to facilitate high-quality, specially-designed instruction, data-based decision-making, PBIS, and implementation of best-practice for students with Autism.
- Engage in personal professional learning to stay abreast of current research, evidence-based practices, national/ state/ local data trends, legal mandates, and serve as a resource and liaison to external agencies and professional organizations.
- Collaborate with local district and public school academy staff, departments and units to maximize achievement for all students.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

- Five or more years of experience working with students with ASD in the school setting.
