### JOB DESCRIPTION:

#### **ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES:**

TRECA Digital Academy provides alternatives to traditional schooling that utilize 21<sup>st</sup>-century technology, allowing students to progress at their own pace. The School Psychologist works with students and alongside staff members to facilitate learning and promote the cognitive, social, and personal development of all students. The School Psychologist is primarily responsible for traveling and meeting with students and staff off-site as needed (estimated at 3 days per week) in addition to providing support from a home office and/or our Marion, Ohio office (estimated in-office 1 day per week). TDA will provide transportation or cover transportation costs.

#### **PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:**

- Identify and assess the learning, development, and adjustment characteristics and needs of individuals and groups, as well as the environmental factors that affect learning and adjustment.
- Maintain knowledge of legal and state regulations in reference to the practice of School Psychology.
- Develop and implement appropriate intervention strategies and programs.
- Provide interventions to students to support the teaching process and maximize learning and adjustment.
- Provide consultation to parents, teachers and other school personnel, and community agencies to enhance the learning and adjustment of students.
- Assist in the planning, development, and evaluation of programs to meet identified learning and adjustment needs.
- Deliver a planned and coordinated program of psychological services.
- Apply ethics and standards of professional practice in the delivery of school psychological services and observe relevant laws and policies that govern practice.
- Participate in professional organizations and continually seek to improve professional knowledge and skill.
- Attend and participate in meetings, conferences, and team activities as assigned.
- Meet with students as assigned.
- Interface daily with all required organizational communication systems.
- Perform any and all related duties as assigned.
