Required Qualifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • High school diploma or equivalent. • Bachelor's degree from an accredited college/university. • Current Kansas State Teaching Certificate on file in the Central Office. • Health and Inoculation Certificate on file in the Central Office. • Have a valid driver's license, be able to drive, and qualify under the district's insurance carrier when driving a district vehicle. • Desire to continue career improvement.
Physical Requirements & Conditions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Requires prolonged sitting or standing. • Occasionally requires physical exertion to manually move, lift, carry, pull, or push heavy objects or materials up to 20 lbs. • Occasional stooping, bending, and reaching. • Requires some travel. • Must work indoors and outdoors year-round. • Must work in noisy and crowded environments.
General Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oversee, direct, and coordinate the performance of the Play. • Develop a budget for the entire production with the assistance of administration. • Promote an appreciation of the performing arts. • Ensure that all drama activities conform to KSHSAA guidelines. • Communicate effectively with all members of the school district and community. • Work effectively with community organizations. • React to change productively and handle other tasks as assigned. • Support the value of an education. • Support the philosophy and vision of USD 230.
Essential Functions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oversee, direct, coordinate, and supervise the Play. • Develop a budget for the entire production with the assistance of

administration.

- Supervise the collection and disbursement of all funds.
- Coordinate the selection of appropriate scripts with approval by principal.
- Ensure the proper purchasing and care of equipment, sets, materials, and supplies. Maintain inventory of the same.
- Audition and recruit students to participate in performances.
- Ensure that all participants meet eligibility rules.
- Coordinate and supervise rehearsals.
- Work effectively with the musical director, set designer, and others involved in dramatic productions.
- Organize and supervise all student personnel during rehearsal and production sessions.
- Promote the production through posters, media advertising, and programs.
- Complete and submit the proper forms for regional and state competition.
- Present a letter of recognition (emblem) to all students who meet the proper qualifications.
- Coordinate and supervise transportation.
- Coordinate and supervise student fundraising activities.
- See that district policies are observed during all activities.
- Keep abreast of new information, innovative ideas and techniques.
- Obtain advance approval of the Activities Director and Principal for all club activities and expenditures.
- Adhere to all district health and safety policies, including all precautions of the Bloodborne Pathogens Exposure Control Plan.
- Other duties as assigned by the Activities Director, Principal, or other Administrative Staff.
