The Sign Language Interpreter plays a vital role in facilitating communication between deaf or hard of hearing individuals and hearing individuals across a variety of topics and situations. The interpreter performs responsible and complex sign language interpreting and utilizes multiple modes of communication, including oral interpreting and deaf-blind interpreting, to meet the diverse needs of students and staff. In addition, the interpreter provides technical assistance in the development of programs and activities that support the deaf and hard of hearing community. This position requires close collaboration with staff members, parents, and guardians to ensure equitable access to communication and services, as well as the performance of related duties as assigned. The successful candidate is required to reside in New Jersey within one year of employment.

- Twelve ASL credits and score of 3 or higher on EIPA
