General Description:

The Certified Nurses Assistant involves working closely with teachers, therapists, and other school staff to assist students with daily needs, provide instructional support, and ensure a safe and inclusive learning environment. Responsible for instructional, functional, cognitive, behavioral, social and/or emotional support and motivation in the educational setting under the direction of special and general education teachers, administrators, and other team members as appropriate.

Key Responsibilities:

1. Lifting and Transferring

- Safely lift, transfer, and reposition students with physical disabilities using proper body mechanics or assistive devices (e.g., gait belts, lifts).
- Assist students in and out of wheelchairs, classroom chairs, therapy equipment, or buses as needed.

2. Mobilitu Assistance

- Support students with walking, using mobility aids (walkers, canes), or navigating hallways and school grounds.
- Escort students to and from classrooms, therapy sessions, or other school activities.

3. Toileting and Personal Hygiene

- Assist students with toileting routines, including transferring to/from the toilet or changing table.
- Provide diapering, catheter care, or other hygiene support as required by medical or IEP guidelines.

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• Maintain cleanliness and dignity while following all health and safety protocols.

4. Feeding and Positioning

- o Assist with feeding, including use of feeding tubes or adaptive utensils as needed.
- Ensure proper positioning of students during and after meals to support digestion and prevent aspiration.
- o Monitor students during eating to ensure safety.

5. Medical and Health Monitoring

- Observe and report any changes in physical condition or behavior to the school nurse or appropriate staff.
- Assist with basic health-related tasks under the supervision of licensed personnel (e.g., range-of-motion exercises, basic therapy support).

6. Emergency Support

- Provide physical support during medical or behavioral emergencies (e.g., seizures, falls).
- Follow emergency protocols and assist in evacuating students safely during drills or actual emergencies.

7. Equipment Handling

- o Operate and maintain specialized equipment (e.g., wheelchairs, standers, lifts).
- o Ensure that all mobility or adaptive equipment is used correctly and safely.

8. Collaboration with Staff

- Work closely with physical therapists, occupational therapists, and special education staff to implement physical care plans.
- Attend meetings or trainings related to physical care and safety procedures.

Section II: Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Instructional Support

- Assist classroom teachers with academic and behavioral support for students with special needs.
- Help implement Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) under the supervision of certified staff
- Support students during classroom activities, transitions, and instructional tasks.
- Assist with adaptive learning tools and communication devices as needed.

Personal Care & Mobility Support

- Assist students with daily living activities, including toileting, diapering, feeding, and hygiene needs.
- Provide physical assistance with mobility, including lifting and transferring students using safe and approved methods.
- Monitor and support students' health-related needs as directed by the school nurse.

Behavioral & Emotional Support

- Implement behavior management strategies under the guidance of the teacher or behavior specialist.
- Assist with de-escalation and redirection techniques when necessary.
- Foster a positive, supportive, and respectful environment for students with disabilities.

Collaboration & Communication

- Maintain confidentiality and professionalism at all times.
- Communicate effectively with students, staff, and families when appropriate.
- Work collaboratively with teachers, therapists, nurses, and other support staff.

Safety & Compliance

- Follow all district policies, health protocols, and safety procedures.
- Document care and support provided as required.
- Participate in staff meetings, training sessions, and professional development opportunities.
- Maintain high level of ethical behavior and confidentiality
- Model positive behavior and positive language
- Follow directions of supervisory professionals
- Transition students to and from the bus and from one classroom to another
- Supervise assigned students at lunch, recess and other classes as appropriate
- Assist students with toileting care and hygiene when needed
- Prepare instructional materials and maintain supplies under the direction of certified staff
- Encourage development of positive social and communication skills, self-esteem, creativity, and self-reliance
- Collaborate with teachers to support daily instruction and student progress
- Administer assessments to special education students as needed as directed and instructed by certified staff.
- Observe and collect data on student behavior and/or performance after appropriate training from certified staff is provided
- Support behavior intervention plans using the same emphasis and techniques as the teacher after appropriate training from certified staff is provided
- Provide feedback to supervisors to assist with their design of individual student programs
- Modify instructional assignments under the supervision of the teacher
- Attend staff, PPT/504 meetings and parent conferences at the request of the teacher or administrator
- Work with individual children or in small groups to reinforce new skills initially introduced by the teacher
- Assist with field trips under the supervision of certified staff

- Continuously monitor children to ensure safety at all times
- Assist in maintaining learning supplies in the classroom/resource room including books, paper, calculators, etc.
- Supervise student use of equipment and materials as assigned
- Effectively communicate feedback to motivate students
- Assist in providing for special physical needs of students (may include lifting / repositioning students)
- Uphold high expectations for student achievement and behavior
- Work effectively with students, teachers, parents and community agencies and other groups
- Attend professional learning opportunities as directed by supervisory personnel
- Use technology and adaptive equipment to assist students in accessing the educational program
- Performs other tasks as assigned by Administrator or designee
