- Must have completed NIMS (National Incident Management System) courses: 100, 200, 700, and 800.
- Strong knowledge and teaching experience in Anatomy, Physiology, and Medical Terminology.
- Ability to obtain an educational certification license through Kent State University or a district-supported program, if not already held.
- Teaching experience preferred.
